

ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

The Department of Mental Health's two-day Spring Training Institute brings together professionals from across Missouri who gather to network with colleagues and share evidence-based practices and successful solutions to workplace challenges.

This year's schedule offers over 60 separate sessions that will broaden participants' knowledge, enhance their skills, and deepen their understanding of the critical needs and resources available to the citizens of Missouri. New for 2012 are tracks on Employment, Wellness, and Military/Veterans Issues.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

If you are in any way connected to mental illness, recovery or developmental disabilities fields, you are likely to find something of value in this conference, especially if you need Continuing Education credit.

Counselors, Social Workers, Rehabilitation Therapists, Case Managers, Nurses, Psychologists, Mental Health Managers, QMRPs, QMHPs, Aides, Administrators, Corrections Workers, Vocational Rehabilitation, Veterans Administration, public sector or private practice—there should be something here for you.

LEARNING TRACKS

CHILDREN, YOUTH AND FAMILIES

This year's children and youth track appeals to all-providing glimpses into an array of issues pertaining to the care and coordination for children. Attendees will find valuable information on drug-endangered children, early emotional development, DBT case conceptualization, youth suicide prevention, Reactive Attachment Disorder, and System of Care coordination.

CO-OCCURRING DISORDERS

Physical and mental health issues often accompany substance use disorders. This year we will focus on, among other things, HIV prevention and addiction treatment in women, and multi-cultural issues in the treatment of co-occurring disorders.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE

Sessions this year will focus largely on helping reduce repeat offenses and recidivism by engaging families, helping people deal with their very real day-to-day issues, and understanding how to measure the effectiveness of a treatment program. We will also deal with continuing treatment of sex offenders in community settings.

EMPLOYMENT

Our Keynote presenter, Denise Bissonnette, will help us learn how to uncover people's assets, develop motivation, and overcome barriers on the road to finding employment and improving the quality of their lives.

FAITH-BASED AND RECOVERY SUPPORTS

Sessions in this track are designed for entry level to professional staff working in faith based and nontraditional treatment and recovery support programs. This year sessions focus on recovery coaching, professionalism, integration of science and faith in counseling, and supporting soldiers returning home from active duty.

HOT TOPICS

There is a lot of important information that either crosses tracks or doesn't fit neatly onto a given track. Here's where you'll find topics related to special populations, eating disorders or even new treatment modalities. It's also a good place to look for those all-important ethics sessions.

MILITARY/VETERANS ISSUES

Thousands upon thousands of military personnel are returning from often multiple deployments with many needs. Our experts this year will guide us through issues such as Traumatic Brain Injury, PTSD and Military Sexual Abuse. Learn, too, about connecting people with resources in their local communities.

SUBSTANCE ABUSE PREVENTION AND MENTAL HEALTH PROMOTION

In addition to looking at the latest adolescent drug trends, we'll focus on how we gather information and how we connect families with young children with needed resources.

TRAUMA

In this year's Trauma track, we will discuss specific tools caregivers can use, as well as trauma related to the Joplin, MO tornado and domestic violence.

WELLNESS

Our new wellness track will start with an overview, explore Wellness Coaching, and then provide specific skills and strategies.


