Tricksters compared with heroes— what is heroism?

“Loyalty in action, regardless obstacles or challenges, to one’s most cherished values — this is the essence of moral rectitude — and it is the foundation of heroism.” Andrew Bernstein

Heroism as initiation or hero's journey

* The Half Boy — stages of the hero's journey

Global initiation today — Covid and climate change?

Fame replacing actual heroism

Extremism as enantiodromía

Superheroes: by-passing heroism

* The Snake Prince — hyper-masculinity

The ultimate trick?

* Story of god hiding

“If you bring forth what is within you, what you bring forth will save you. If you don’t bring forth what is within you, what you do not bring forth will destroy you.” Gospel of Thomas

Bringing hero and trickster together:

- * Story of Eisik's Dream
- * Story of Fatima (gift with wound)

Trickster offers non-violent conflict resolution:

* Dealing with drug dealers knocking at your door
(you know, by mistake!)
